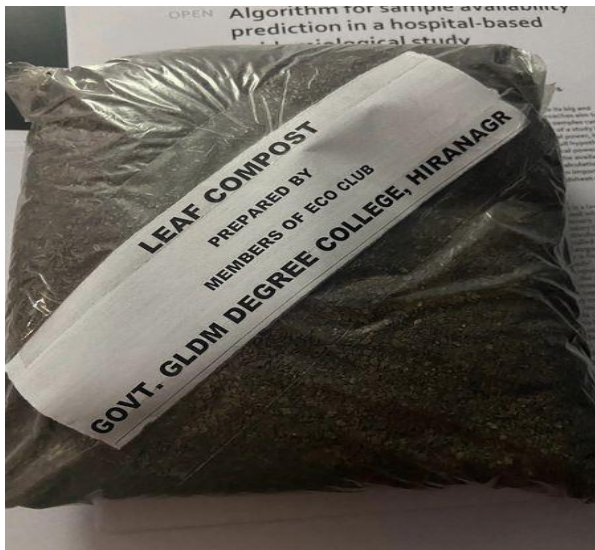
IQAC shall evolve mechanisms and procedures for

Keeping in view the importance of compost and availability of different types of leaves in the premises of college owing to GDC, Hiranagar having a Mango orchard, Department of Environmental Sciences & ECO-CLUB in collaboration with IQAC established leaf compost unit at GLDM degree college Hiranagar on 4th APRIL 2022. The dry leaves of different types were collected and put in 5 bins and later on shifted to compost pit.

The fallen leaves were seen as a waste, a nuisance and burden. Daily falling tree leaves generate a large number of dry leaves that requires a proper management. Among traditional waste disposal methods, composting is considered more sustainable and eco-friendly for handling the leaf waste. Composting



leaves is a terrific way to recycle and create a nutrient rich garden soil and amendment at the same time. The benefits of leaf compost are numerous. The compost increases the porosity of the soil, raises the fertility, diminishes the strain on landfills, and creates a living "blanket" over the plants.

The whole process of leaf compost was completed in the month of October under the supervision of Ms. Neha Bhagat

(HOD EVS & CONVENOR ECO-CULB) and other members of the eco-club. The packets of prepared leaf compost were readily taken up by staff and students of the college. Principal of the college Dr. Pragya Khanna today congratulated the members of the ECO-CULB for their efforts in preparing leaf compost and also motivated the students to work for the betterment of the environment in future also.

The workshop at GDC Samba was inaugurated by the Principal of the College and at GLDM GDC Hiranagar by Prof. Shujaut Khan, Coordinator IQAC and Head Department of Computer Sciences. The expert trainer

MS. Monica Chanda is dancer of a major form of Indian classical dance that is Bharatanatyam which had originated in Tamil Nadu which expresses South Indian religious themes and spiritual ideas, particularly of Shaivism and in general of Hinduism. The form of classical dance is noted for its fixed upper torso, bent legs and knees flexed (Arai mandi) combined with spectacular footwork, and a sophisticated vocabulary of sign language based on gestures of hands, eyes, and face muscles. Ms. Monica Chanda is Bharat Nirman Awardee and General Council Member of Sangset Natak Akademi. The workshop was attended by participants from three different Colleges. Around 70 students partici-

ated in the workshop. Prof. Shujaut Khan in his inaugural address praised the efforts of Dr. Bharat Bhushan, Head Department of Music, Dr. Mukesh Kumar, Dr. Arun Kumar and Mr. Vikram Jamwal in organising programmes of National relevance. In spite of a number of initiatives by the Govt. of India the position of the country has been improved in the global hunger index. Therefore the need of the time is to widen the enthusiasm for scientific intrusion in hinterlands. Prof. R.N. Gohil in his presidential address

praised the Principal and the College in organizing and providing a platform to different institutions to discuss and ponder on issues of such relevance. He also appreciated the efforts of the participants who participated in the poster making and paper reading competition. Prof. Gohil enlightened the gathering about the works and programmes of the National Academy of Sciences India which is an oldest society of the country which was established 92 years ago. The society now has 21 Chapters spanning across the nation. The society is constituted of Fellows, advisors and members. He further said the availability of food is not sufficient but substituted it with the availability of balanced nutrition. On the similar pattern food with similar nutritional value needs to be marketed and made a regular part of the diet.
